President's Report

The 2002/2003 season is seen as the beginning of a rebuilding process for our competition in the heart of Sydney's North Shore. The season had a shaky start, with some teams withdrawing due to lack of numbers, but this created the impetus to forge a useful alliance with the neighbouring Northern Suburbs Cricket Association.

B Grade matches were always competitive. A great initiative was playing "bye" games against neighbouring Northern Suburbs teams, to provide variety and ensure all teams played each week. West Pymble Trojans were the outstanding performers of the season, with 4 centuries scored. They lost only one match during the preliminary rounds, only to be defeated by the newly promoted Wanderers Colts in a low scoring final.

C Grade produced a fine season of wickets and runs, and new comers KP Philby's were a great addition to the competition. Two hat tricks were taken in C Grade this year. The final came down to traditional rivals, Pigs and Macquarie Uni, with Macquarie Uni claiming the premiership. The final was a great example of sportsmanship, with both teams providing their own umpires who officiated with great impartiality on two tense days.

We entered our three best teams in the Northern Suburbs A Grade competition. Wanderers won the NSCA A Grade one day competition, while West Pymble Nomads defeated Wanderers in the final of the A Grade competition.

For me, the highlight of the season was the first B/C Grade representative match against Northern Suburbs. Playing as a team with regular opponents was greatly enjoyed by all, and the amazing come from behind victory by four runs showed the closeness of the teams.

Thanks to those correspondents who took the time to submit weekly contributions to our website on both the serious and light hearted incidents of each weekend. It was most enjoyable every week to read the match reports submitted by the budding "Peter Roebucks" of the Association.

We have a long road in front of us, to attract teams into our competition. We have excellent grounds, and a friendly, yet competitive battle on the pitches each week. Cricket Australia and Cricket NSW are reviewing the future of community cricket in order to make better use of the reduction in numbers of volunteers to manage cricket, and we hope our Association will be at the centre of community cricket on the North Shore.

This may well be the final Annual Report of the Gordon District Junior Cricket Association (Seniors) as we will be voting to change our name to Cricket North Shore.

I heartily thank Vera Lorence and The Gordon Social and Recreation Club for providing us with meeting facilities on a regular basis.

I thank those who been involved in the running of the competition this year, especially all office bearers and those who attended the regular delegates meetings. Special thanks go to Ross Rheuben (Treasurer) and Stephen Clarke (Records Officer) for their efforts. We all must show the greatest gratitude to our secretary, Terry O'Donnell, whose tireless work, both in and out of season, ensures we have grounds to play on, and an opposition to play!

Final thanks goes to all you who played cricket this season. Cricket is our national summer sport, and we all play the game for the unique mix of competition, exercise and social interaction it provides. I look forward to welcoming you to our competition in 2003/2004.

Commencing this season, all teams were invited to submit end-of-season reports for inclusion in the Annual Report.

B Grade – West Pymble Trojans

The West Pymble Trojans had a good season that was marred by one poor Saturday. Unfortunately it was the most important day of the season, the Grand Final. Full credit should go to the Wanderers Colts who outplayed us on this day and finished B grade premiers. The Trojans had a very enjoyable season only losing one game during the regular season and that was to Old Ignatians in a one day game against a Northern suburbs team. It was a season where we got ourselves out of trouble with both bat and ball at different times, in which it was a real team effort, with plenty of laughs along the way.

DAVID CHIPPENDALE (629 runs @ 48.38, 10 wickets @ 26.90) was our rock around our batting was built, his highest score was 118 and 3 other scores in the 90's really helped us get off to the start we required. If only he could run between wickets and play the pull shot then he could have nearly doubled his aggregate.

STEVE CHIPPENDALE (402 runs @ 28.71, 24 wickets @ 19.17) opened both the batting and bowling and really took the attack to the bowlers, and it was not unusual to see the opening bowlers shaking their heads in disbelief when a good ball was dispatched to the boundary. He also bowled with plenty of pace.

MICHAEL PAYNE (250 runs @ 27.78, 1 wicket @ 6) the old man of the team, was unlucky with the bat, but showed his class in the semi final with a real craftsman 113 including hitting a rare six to ring up the triple figures.

JOHN WINTER (450 runs @ 40.91) a stylish hard hitting left hander batsman, who hit a team high score of 134. The outstanding fieldsman of the team with 14 catches, and possibly the biggest six seen hit for many a season in the grand final, over the trees at William Cowan.

ROSS CHIPPENDALE (449 @ 40.82, 29 wickets @ 19.62) was the team all rounder, and could always be relied upon to produce with both bat and ball at any given time. He also took 13 catches.

MALCOLM WALDOC (36 runs @ 9, 2 wickets @ 25) joined the team after Christmas and was a handy pick up who filled the vital first slips position and took 5 catches.

DAN RIDLEY (140 runs @ 28) did not get many chances, but always made the most of any given ones. Received plenty of arse taps from the Chippendales at the celebration of wickets.

KARL THOMAS (65 runs @ 21.67, 19 wickets @ 14.89) when given the chance with the ball always tied an end up and picked up wickets with good control whilst swinging the ball.

MIKE HEVER (116 runs @ 23.20, 45 wickets @ 19.91) stepped up this season and took the new ball and with great control destroyed many a batting line ups, and at a great economy rate. Had trouble getting the ball out of his hands at times bowling 180.4 overs for the season.

GUY KINGSMILL (22 runs @ 4.40) could always be relied on to provide plenty of entertainment with the bat in hand, as he attempted to take the attack up to any and every bowler. Was known as the claw in the field as he fielded in the gully and managed to stop plenty of balls that a normal human would not be able to stop.

IAN PETERSON (20 runs @ 6.67) played the first part of the season before joining the police force, was one of the hardest fielders and chased plenty of balls down that were well and truly on their way to the boundary.

MARK PALMER (7 runs @ 7, 7 wickets @ 15.57) another veteran of the team who always delivered when relied upon to give plenty. Provided many a comical moment with his bowling and mixture of balls bowled.

RODNEY EDENHOPHER (0 runs 2 0, 6 wickets @ 16.83) unfortunately injury curtailed his season, but when playing certainly kept the team in fits of laughter with his commentary of the game and going ons. It was a most enjoyable season and a big thank you goes to all the players and opposition teams. All games were played in a good spirit and were always hard fought games.

Special mention should be made of the other members of the West Pymble club for their support and encouragement during the season.

The successful season would not have happened without the outstanding work of Tim Wilkinson (President) and Terry O'Donnell (Secretary) of the association, who really led from the front and showed tremendous leadership and professionalism.

BRING ON SEASON 2003/04.

B Grade – Wanderers Hackers

The 2002/2003 season saw two former rivals, Wanderers B and Hackers merge to form a new team. Many suggestions for the new team name were considered, before the highly imaginative name of "Wanderers Hackers" was chosen. The teams merged together successfully, with all players demonstrating a love of playing the game hard and sledging their own team-mates in preference to opponents. It was an enjoyable season, but regrettably the results did not reflect the natural ability of the players.

With 5 wins and 10 losses, Wanderers Hackers scraped into the semi finals, only to be beaten by their continued nemesis, West Pymble Trojans. That semi final followed a typical pattern of good, but often unlucky bowling, and a batting collapse. One bright thing in the semi final was much better fielding and catching than normal.

Our match of the season was Round 4 versus West Pymble Chaps. Chasing 154 from the Chaps, we were dismissed for a poor 67 at William Cowan, St Ives, and were asked to bat again. Chaps had dominated us for 3 sessions, but Wanderers Hackers came out blasting after tea on Day 2, with Blizzard, Bursle, Hackett, Toltz and Middleton contributing to a quick fire 192, leaving Chaps 105 to win from the last 20 overs. Chaps swung the bat and Wanderers Hackers took the wickets, led by season best performance of Michael Kent with 5/33 and Malouf's 3/15, resulting in a nailbiting outright win with a few balls to spare.

The season's highest score was 96 by Craig Allen v Trojans. Highest run scorers were Glenn Blizzard (300 @ 20), Michael Bursle (252 @ 21), Artie Kalpidis (225 @ 17.3) and Craig Allen (206 @ 14.7). Best of the bowlers were Michael Kent (30 @ 17.2), Tim Wilkinson (17 @ 21.3), Merrick Malouf (11 @ 24.3) and Matthew Ashdown (11 @ 31.8). Steve Ruskin held the most catches (5), while Craig Allen took 4 stumpings and 8 catches as our main keeper. Thanks to other regulars in the team (and at the Willoughby Hotel afterwards) - Leeroy Mackay, Glen Hetherington, Johnny Allsop.

The hard luck story of the season goes to Justin Whyte, who, when facing just his second ball, slipped on the pitch and badly broke his leg, while highlights of the season were the colourful exchanges of banter between players after any of the dropped catches.

A tough, but enjoyable season, and bring on 2003/2004.

C Grade – Winnie Bs

Overall, 2002/2003 was the best season in the Winnie Blues relatively short history, 1 outright win, 9 first innings wins, 1 tied match, 4 1st innings losses, and only 1 outright loss. It was tough finding a consistent team, and this was shown through drawing on a pool of 20 players for the year. We came equal 2nd on the ladder, and lost in the semi final to a top Macquarie Uni outfit who went on to lift the trophy. It was a very good year and we can all look forward to some exciting seasons in the future, as Cricket North Shore expands.

C Grade – Macquarie Uni

Mac Uni enjoyed a very successful season to secure their first premiership in the Gordon Competition after fielding many a side over the past 12 years. With a team made up mostly of the struggling Green side of the previous two years, Ben Sewell's side became much more consistent, thanks to steady contributions from most of the regular players. The side played enthusiastic cricket throughout the season, though it would be fair to say that a ruthless streak did emerge on occasion. Despite recording a nine win, five loss record over the regular season we went into the semi final series needing a major form reversal after a flogging from the West Pymble Heathens in Round 16. The return of Benny Sewell proved to be a catalyst and a number of players stepped up for the final 2 matches against the willing Blues and desperately unlucky Pigs.

On the player front Viv Samdarshi (362 runs) was our batting leader through the year, dominating at the crease and making a superbly gritty 50 on a greentop in the semi final. Kain Walker (280 runs, 25 catches, 3 stumpings) was central to our efforts and made classy 50's against the Dreggs, Kissing Point and Northern Suburbs (the Representative Match). His keeping in the finals was first rate, a stunning stumping off our fast bowler in the Final being a crucial blow. Other fine 50's came from Ben Bradley, Tom Millet, Shane Wilcek and Dougal Michie. Steve Johnson (142*) played a remarkable knock against the Small Potatoes when we were on the rack. The most satisfying innings of the year for many though was Dinuke Christie David's blazing 51 in the Semi Final, made in about 25 balls and putting the Winnie Blues under enormous pressure. Elsewhere Mark McCormack, Matt Chambers, Adam Wilcek, Andrew McWhinney, Andrew Gleeson and Brynley Walters added some starch to our efforts, particularly against the new ball. Down the order Simon Clayton, Ben Sewell, Tony Barnes and Darren Bull swung like rusty gates to frequently boost the total.

Bowling wise the team was well served by a number of players. Tom Millet (26 wickets) led the attack and was later joined by Dayan Jayamanne (20 wickets). Dayan was our player of the finals with 5-32 in both matches. Tony Barnes (31 wickets) provided solid back up including a once in a blue moon performance of 8-47 against the Dreggs. Simmo, our leggie bowled extremely skilfully to take 14 wickets, including 3 in the semi final. Unfortunately he missed the final after a much debated training mishap in the lead up to the game. Our bowling also gained an edge from the menacing pace of Benny (22 wickets in 62 overs) and Gleeso (14 wickets) and the cricketing smarts of Viv (17 wickets in 60 overs). Bully (3 wickets) failed to fire with the ball but was easily the best of our outfielders with several spectacular catches and a rocket launcher for an arm.

Finally thanks to the Association for staging a very enjoyable competition and to the other teams for tolerating our occasional excesses and for the sporting way you played the game. See you next season.

C Grade – KP Philby's

In their inaugural season in the G.J.D.C.A., the Philby's would like to thank Tim, Stephen, Terry and Ross for making us welcome.
